A guidance program is set up as a special agency to take care of the varied needs and special talents of the students in Monongahela High School.

The guidance personnel assists pupils in making choices and adjustments at important crossroads in their lives. They also give guidance to the students that they may solve their own problems and discover methods of self analysis and improvement.

Some source material used to assist achieving the above aims are mental aptitude tests and interest inventory tests. Personal counseling and conferences are provided along with homeroom programs, classroom and club projects, and many other activities.

The guidance office exists for the purpose of helping the pupils in every way possible.

Its services guide him in his choice of course of studies as determined by the results of tests indicating his abilities and preferences in types of work. His counselors are available for discussion and help on any problem that may arise during his school years. A complete record of his scholastic attainments, special abilities, characteristics, and activities is kept in the office files so that recommendation may be made as requested in future years.

Information may be obtained from this office concerning the requirements of different colleges, scholarships available, and requirements for positions in business and industry that may be open to the high school graduate.

The same guidance counselor works with a class from the freshman through the senior years, so that he becomes well acquainted with the individual class member and his problems and is well able to give him the help and advice he needs.


SERVICE CENTER

One of our keenest high school memories will be of those Friday assemblies when the cheerleaders led the student body with cheers of "Fight, Team, Fight".




