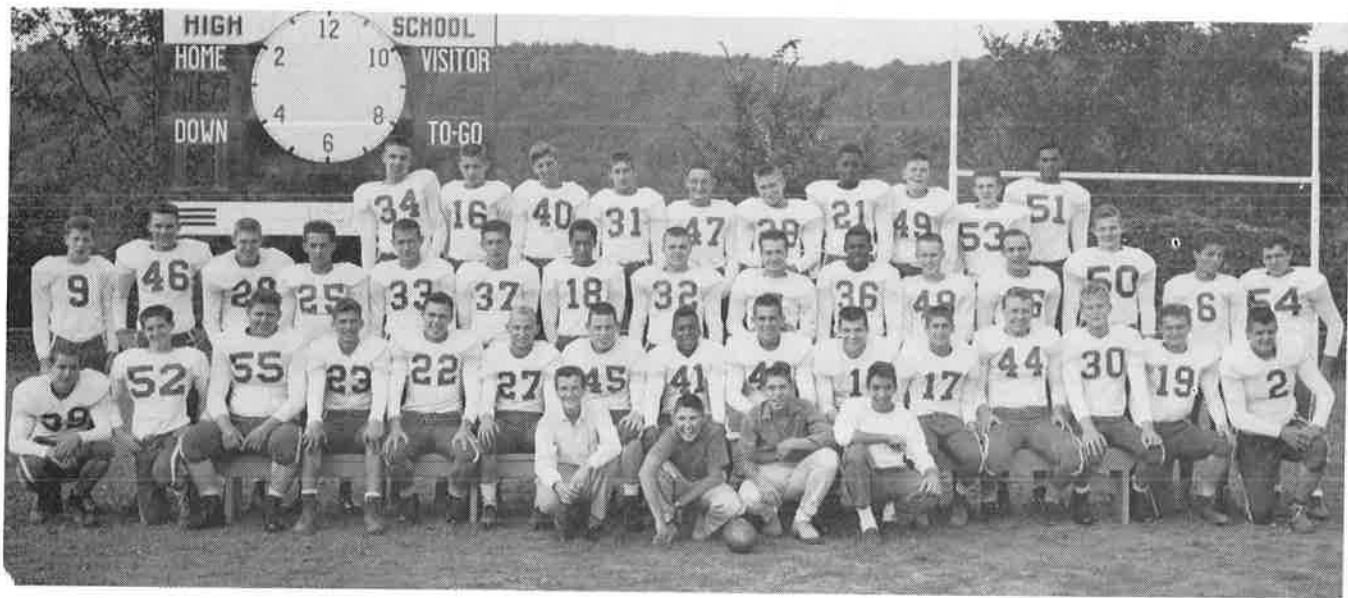
ATHLETICS

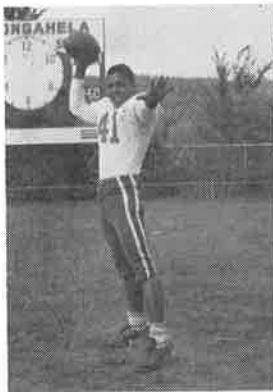

The "58" Wildcat Varsity Football team completed one of its finest seasons in years, winning five, losing three, and tying one.

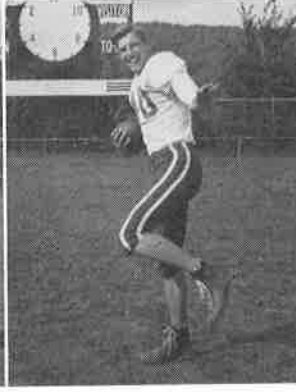
