LONGMONT - Marilyn Labuda may not be working in a classroom, but she continues to touch the lives of people in our community.

Labuda had a distinguished career in Boulder County schools for 37 years. She worked as both a teacher and a principal. She is listed in the 1996 edition of "Who's Who Among America's Teachers" ${ }^{"}$

Last spring, she attended the wedding of a former student. "I had the whole wedding party in my class at one time or another," she said.

As a principal, Labuda was elected president of the National Association of Elementary School Principals but turned down the position when she learned that she would have to leave her school to travel the country.

Now her years of experience and passion for people are being expressed as a volunteer. Labuda spends one morning a week at Columbine Elementary, where she works one-on-one with four firstBrade students, tutoring them in reading with her special brand of TLC.

Labuda also spends one day a week at the Mountain States Children's Home, helping the children who live and are schooled there Working with small groups, she helps them with their studies and gives them the attention and encouragement they need.

Her involvement doesn't end there, though. "I see them every Sunday at church," Labuda said.

Labuda lived at The Bridge for a short time. Although she has moved, she is still very much a part of that community. She volunteers at The Bridge three days a week.

Labuda assists the activities director by helping the residents on their outings, including shopping and trips to the movies or the zoo.
"Marilyn is a special volunteer. Having lived at The Bridge previously, she is a triend to the residents and can relate with where they are at this point in their lives," said Barbara Ward, activities director at The Bridge, "She is an inspiration."

By her example, Labuda teaches perhaps the greatest lesson of them all.
